My name is Anthony Lang and I am 23 years old. I was born in Redwood City, but moved to the Santa Maria area when I was about five years old. I had a good upbringing and didn't get into too much trouble until I was about 18. I started hanging around with the wrong people and that landed me in jail. For different reasons, I kept ending up in jail and never really seemed to care or change; even though my behavior was getting worse.



It got bad when a very important person in my life, my grandmother, died on July 10, 2014. I started using drugs and that made all my cares in the world go away. I went to jail again, that is when I realized I needed help.

I got ahold of the Central Coast Rescue Mission and had an interview to get into the Life Recovery Program. Since I have been at the mission I have learned how to solve conflict and problems in a healthy way. I have learned life skills by going to work. I have grown in my patience.

Most important though, is I am building my relationship with the Lord. I heard the Gospel preached at church that Christ took away my sins and sorrows. That's what I wanted most of all!

I have started getting involved at church for the first time in my life, and now my sister has been going with me. I am learning to trust God and focus on what He is doing in my life each day. My life is continuing to change for the better because of the love and faith I have gained in God.
