The mission helped me to find a good church and connect with other Christians. I no longer carry around the weight of shame and self-hatred, the weight that nearly killed me.

If I had not come to the mission, I may very well be dead by now, or could have at least lost the relationship with my children and grandchildren. Instead, my relationship with them is deepening, as is my relationship with the Lord. For these reasons, I will always be grateful to Jesus and to the mission for saving my life.
