The insanity of my alcoholism began when I was in seventh grade. As soon as I took that first drink of beer, I immediately knew how much I loved the taste and the feeling it gave me.

Fast forward to high school graduation: because of drinking I threw away a full scholarship to play at Purdue University, to play in the Rose Bowl, and to catch passes from future Super Bowl MVP Drew Brees. Instead of being a guaranteed starting true freshman playing in the big game, I was drowning myself in a bottle of alcohol.

My biggest fear soon came true - I crossed the line into full blown addiction. Rock bottom approached fast. At 28 years old I was broke, overweight, out of shape, and a horrible dad. I was physically, morally, and spiritually bankrupt. My mother was paying every expense imaginable and every last penny I could scrounge went toward alcohol.

The day I got dropped off at the Salvation Army as opposed to living under a bridge somewhere, was the hardest day I've ever had to endure. All my hope was gone and I continued to spit at anything or anybody that tried to help me.

That began a cross country binge, a death defying epic journey from Indianapolis to Portland to Chico, then finally being washed up onto the shores of the Central Coast of California. I believe it was God who washed me ashore, because now, I am here at the Central Coast Rescue Mission. I thank God every day for the roof over my head here at the mission, the clothes on my back, food in my stomach, and most importantly my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

No matter what happens from this moment on, I know that God will not forsake me – that's amazing and I have peace now.

Now twenty years after that first drink, I am in good standing with my family and I have a positive outlook on life. In the best of times or in the darkest times, I will always rely solely upon God. ~ Conor

# An Opportunity to Work Again


Carlina is one of 18 brothers and sisters. She is grateful for her involvement at the Central Coast Super Thrift Store through Path-
