I had three failed marriages, all due to my addiction. I witnessed three friends murdered from gang violence, and I watched other friends go to prison.

I was scared and tired. I could see plain as day that my life was going nowhere. The gangs and my drinking had ruined my life, sadly, before I really even had a life. I knew there was a God, but I had become so scared. All I could feel was fear and weariness; death was the only thing I was sure of. In my time of despair, I prayed to God and asked him to help me somehow.

I found the Central Coast Rescue Mission. Every day I heard good news, and it was all coming from the Bible! The people around me are happy and are kind to me; something I never knew living in the gang life.

HEROES OF THRIFT


