I've been sober for a month and never felt so alive and at peace now that I'm closer to God and have a great support group. I'm blessed that I'm a part of this program that has truly changed my life and has given me a second chance to have a relationship with God.

My program counselors and mentors saw that I needed God's love and forgiveness. And, I needed to forgive myself and others that I felt had hurt me. One of my key life verses now is, "And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive him, so that your father in heaven may forgive your sins, but if you do not forgive, neither will your father who is in heaven forgive your sins."
